Concept note

A Two-Day National Workshop titled “Samvardhini” will be conducted on the theme “Uniform Scientific and Technical Terminology for Indian Languages.”

After the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, have been given renewed emphasis at all levels of education. With this development, the need for uniformity in scientific and technical terminology has grown in all Indian languages. For example, in Malayalam or Tamil, technical terms used in educational institutions across India should be uniform. In the same way, there must be a standardized and uniform set of technical terminologies in Sanskrit at the national level.

Fortunately, Sanskrit has a vast capacity to generate new words for new concepts and objects, owing to its scientific grammatical framework—Vyākaraṇa-śāstra and Nirukta, one of the Vedāṅgas. In the future, when science and technology are increasingly taught through Sanskrit, a large body of scientific and technical terminology will be required. Therefore, it is essential to understand the process of technical word formation in Sanskrit and to provide training to traditional Vyākaraṇa scholars, college professors, assistant professors, school teachers, and research scholars.

To address this need, a two-day national workshop is being organized by the Bharatiya Bhasha Samiti (BBS), Ministry of Education, Government of India. The workshop is hosted by Amrita Vishwa Vidyapeetham, Kochi Campus, in association with Sree Sankara College, Kalady, and Samskrita Bharati. The workshop will be held on 21st and 22nd January 2025 at Amrita Vishwa

Objectives

- To build capacity in Sanskrit scientific terminology.
- To train scholars in technical word formation using Vyākaraṇa and Nirukta.
- To introduce national standards used in terminology development (CSTT/BBS).
- To explore terminology practices in Tamil, Hindi, and South Indian languages.
- To promote Sārāla Mānaka Saṃskṛtam for academic communication.

Expected Benefits

- Ability to contribute to national glossary projects
- Continued mentorship from experts
- Platform for long-term collaborative outcome.

Major Topics of the Workshop

- The Purpose of Word generation.
- The concept of ‘Simple and Standard Sanskrit’
- The word-generation ability of the Sanskrit language.
- The opinion of Acharya Raghuvēer on the formation of words.
- Initiatives carried out in the domain of Sanskrit word formation.
- The elements that should be considered in the process of word formation.
- The practice of sentence refinement and Word generation.

Although the core focus of the workshop is technical terminology in Sanskrit, special sessions are included to provide Sanskrit scholars with insights into developments in other Indian languages. These sessions include:

- Pan-Indian Vocabulary in Tamil and Sanskrit
- Technical Terminology in Hindi
- Technical Terminology in South Indian Languages

Eminent Sanskrit scholars, linguists, and experts in Vyākaraṇa will serve as the resource persons for this workshop.
